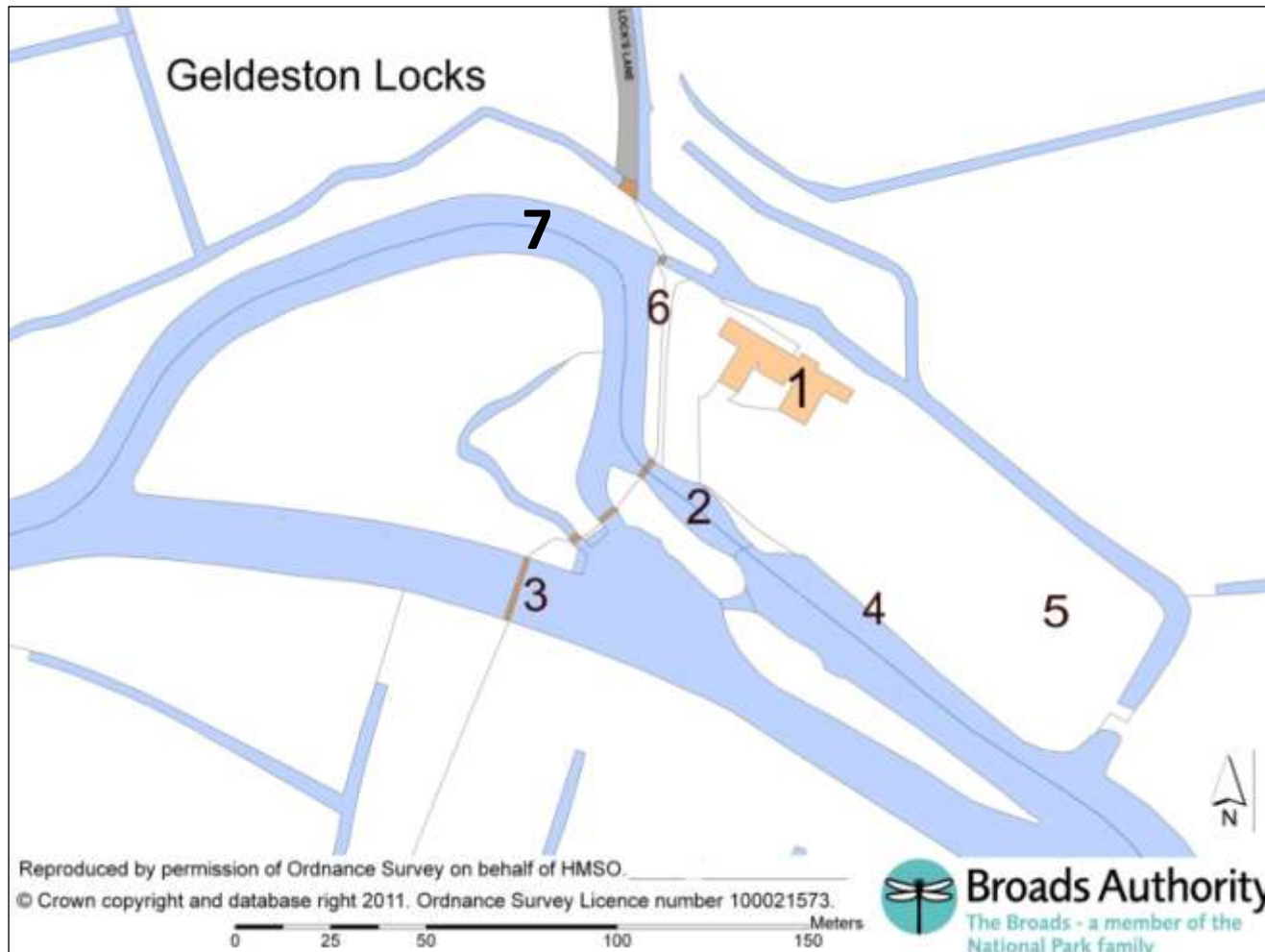


Geldeston Locks Discovery Map - answers



KEY

- 1) The Locks Inn** - home of the lock keeper when the lock was working (1670 – 1934). 1768 had a licence to sell beer. Almost became a private house in 1970s. Still has no mains electricity.
- 2) The lock** – brick-lined, one of three on Waveney built in 1670s. Kept water upstream deep enough for boats all the way up to Bungay. In frequent use by cargo boats on busy route to and from Yarmouth.
- 3) Footbridge** over the flood relief channel dug in 1967.
- 4) 24 hour moorings**
- 5) Wildlife area** Many crack willow trees grow here. Some have fallen but go on growing - lying down.
- 6) Brickwork** on the path shows the site of an old mill
- 7) Old course** of the river. Before 1967 when the flood relief channel was dug, the bend here acted as a bottle-neck and made floods quite frequent
