Discover a landscape mosaic

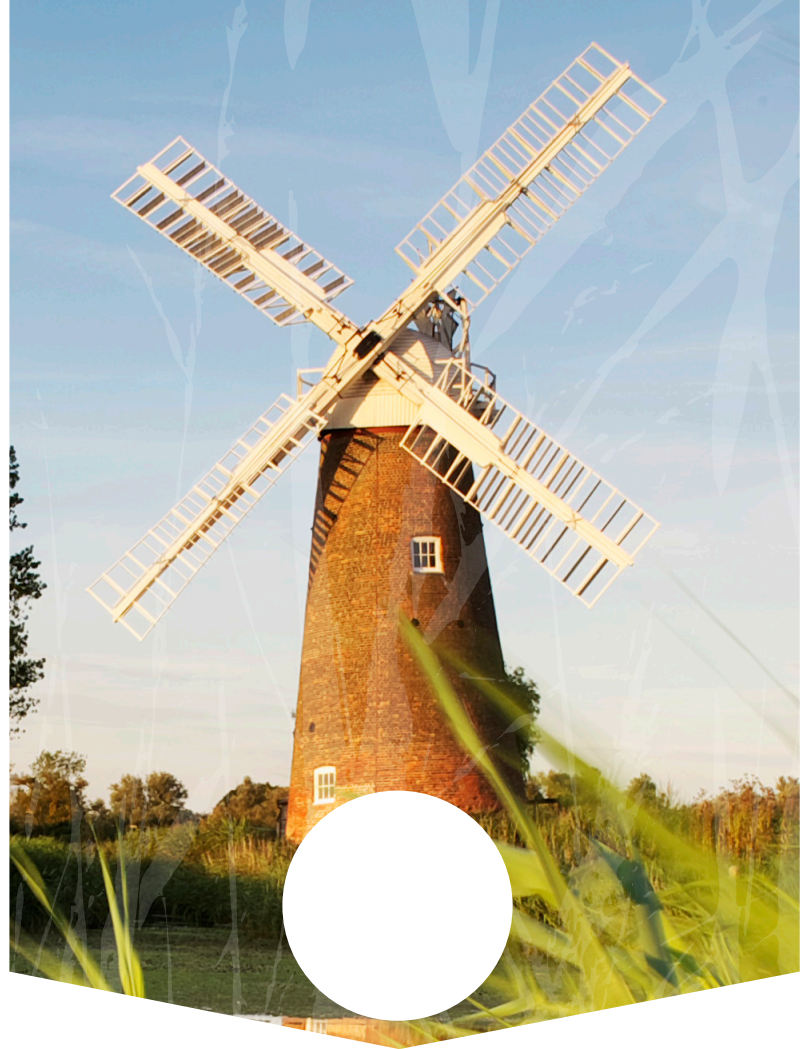
Open water, reed and sedge fens, wet woodland and immense grazing marshes for cattle make up the mosaic of the Broads.

Care for the rare and wild

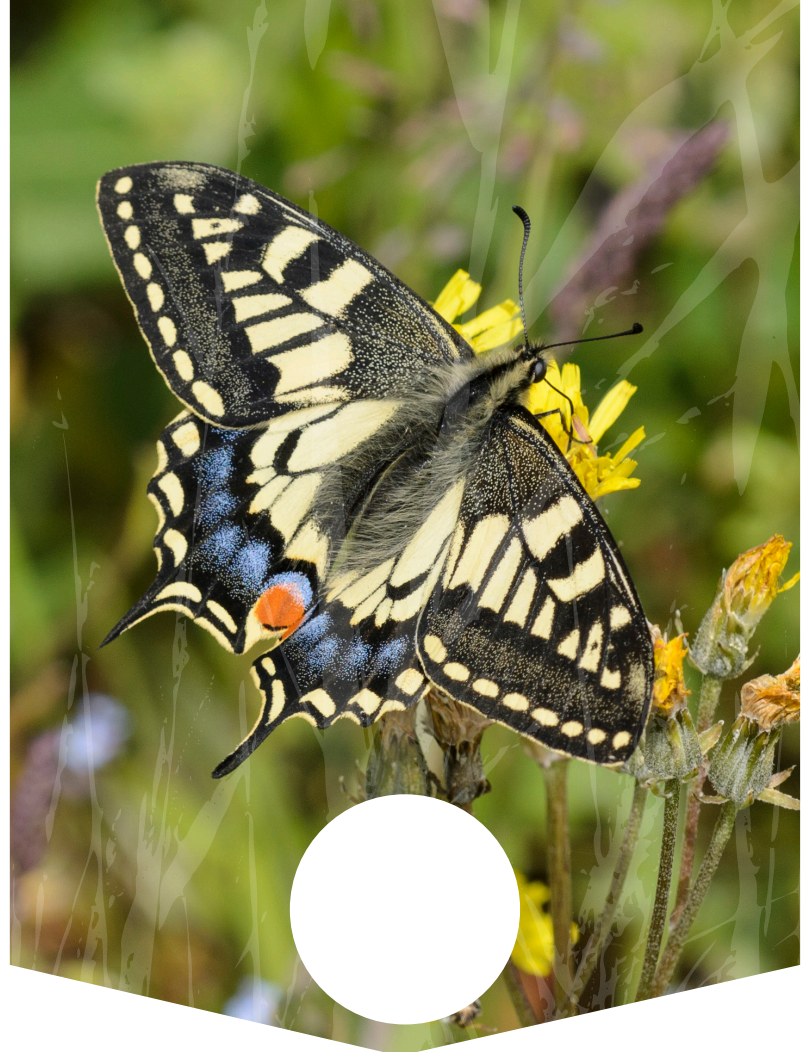

The Broads offers all kinds of boating – inflatable paddleboarding, historic wherry sailing and everything in between. Wear a life jacket when you are on deck, getting on and off or tying up your boat. Canoeists – wear a buoyancy aid. Paddleboarders – wear a buoyancy aid and a tether. Don't swim, except as part of an organised event. Please stay safe.

Water Safety

Visit the water safety zone to **take part** in our **water safety demonstrations**. These will take place **between 10:00-11:30 and 14:00-15:00**.

Delivered by Broads Authority Rangers, RNLI, HM Coastguard, BroadsBeat, Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service, Norfolk County Council, and Whitlingham Adventure the demonstrations explain the basics of rescuing someone from the water. They are *ideally suited to groups with young children* and provide an opportunity to have a go at using rescue throwlines.
